## **Important – Attendance and Punctuality Information**

As you may have seen in the press, the government are committed to raising school attendance and improving punctuality. Educational research clearly shows that children who are persistently absent and those who are regularly late face considerable disadvantages in their education.

Children need to be in their classrooms by **8.55am** for registration. The gates are locked at 9am to give parents chance to leave the grounds. Children who arrive after 8.55 will be marked as 'Late' and those who arrive after 9.10 will be marked as 'Unauthorised Absence'.

No holidays will be authorised and parents **will** receive a fixed penalty notice if holidays are taken during term time.

All children who are persistently absent and/or late will be referred to the Educational Welfare Officer.

## **Collection After School**

If someone new is collecting your child after school, please can you let the school office know ahead of collection time so a message can be passed to the class teacher. This also includes childminders and St Christopher Robins.

## **Communication With Staff**

## **Movement Around the School Grounds**

As you will be aware we now have six classes entering and exiting in the playground. Please be reassured that the outside space has been designed to accommodate a school of potentially up to 630 pupils so there is plenty of room. However, please help us keep the site safe by ensuring that pupils/siblings do not cycle or scoot within the grounds. There have been previous incidents where children have been injured and/or knocked down.

In addition, please do not let your children play with the outside equipment or use the climbing equipment. Our risk assessment prohibits this equipment being used unsupervised by school staff.

On a safeguarding note, if you are buzzed in or out of the pedestrian gate by the office, please do make sure you close the gate behind you.
