In the meantime, we kindly ask for your cooperation in keeping our site safe. Please ensure that students and their siblings refrain from cycling or skating on the premises. We have had past incidents where children have been injured, and your assistance in this matter is greatly appreciated.

Additionally, we request that children do not play on the outdoor equipment or use the climbing structures before and after school. Our risk assessment clearly states that this equipment is to be used only under the supervision of school staff and it is not suitable for younger children.

ATTENDANCE

Our updated Attendance Policy can be found on our website here and a letter outlining the major changes was sent out at the end of last term, however you may find the following information useful:

Changes to codes mean you may see different marks on your child's attendance certificate. e.g. the H code for authorised term-time leave (holiday) has been removed. Headteachers can no longer authorise term-time leave unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Headteachers may issue an attendance penalty notice if there are five or more days of unauthorised absence.

In addition, your child's attendance data will be shared with the Department for Education (DfE) and the Local Authority every day. This will be live data. This allows the DfE to provide schools with the tools to monitor and see improvement in attendance and will allow the Local Authority to provide advice, support and Early Help services.


