
We are immensely grateful to everyone who took the time to share their knowledge and experiences, creating these invaluable learning opportunities for the children

This week, our Year 5 and 6 students participated in a comprehensive first aid training session. They learned essential skills, including resuscitation techniques, how to respond to choking, and practising the recovery position. Additionally, they gained valuable insights into the significance of first aid skills and how to effectively respond in various emergency situations. We were impressed by their engaging questions and their eagerness to learn and practice new skills. Our values of Citizenship, Critical Thinking and Communication were clearly demonstrated throughout both sessions.

ROCKET PHONICS

On Friday, the entire staff team participated in a full day of training on our new phonics scheme, Rocket Phonics. This approach builds on the foundation of our previous Pines programme, while offering a closer alignment with our current phonetically decodable reading scheme.
