It's wonderful to see children from Reception to Year 6 coming together and developing a range of essential skills, including throwing, catching, shooting, batting, and bowling. This inclusive playtime has been a highlight of the week, and we're so proud to see our children building friendships and learning together.

Excitement is building for our upcoming external performance/stage area and this week's Play Assembly gave the children a sneak peek at our new play zones. They'll soon have the option to vote for either a Mud Café or a Large Scale Construction area, both designed to inspire creativity, imagination, and physical activity. The children are eagerly anticipating their new play options and are already thinking critically about how to make the most of each space.



Our children are also demonstrating a remarkable level of maturity and responsibility with regards to our climbing frames. After conducting their own Benefit Risk Assessments, they've identified potential hazards and suggested ways to mitigate them, such as managing crowds and providing hand protection. As a result, they're now free to play on the climbing equipment at any time, without restrictions. This is a testament to their growing awareness of health and safety and their ability to think critically about their play.

We're confident they will lead by example and inspire their peers to take ownership of our outdoor learning environment.

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
