Year 2: What lives where?


Year 3: What lies under our feet?

We are also excited to announce the launch of our new 'Reading for Pleasure' initiative. We are encouraging all students to read for at least five minutes every day as research shows that regular reading, along with being read to, boosts children's imagination, vocabulary, cognitive skills, empathy, and overall well-being. These benefits help to shape confident and curious learners!







To help support your child's reading journey, we kindly ask that parents and carers write a brief note in their child's reading record each time they read at home. A simple comment about how they got on with their reading session would be wonderful. For children in Year 5 and Year 6, this will take place in their reading journals, where they can also add their own reflections and thoughts about their reading activities as they become more independent readers.

To make it even more exciting, we'll be rewarding the children's reading efforts with star stamps! For each reading session completed, children will earn one star stamp. If they collect at least 25 stars in a half term, they will be able to choose a free book to take home, giving them even more opportunities to continue their reading adventures.

WHATSAPP

With the forthcoming Online Safety Act featuring so heavily in the press at the moment (OSA) we wanted to take a moment to remind everyone about the potential dangers of WhatsApp and other messaging apps for children. While these platforms can be seen as a way for children to stay in touch with friends, they also pose some risks, including exposure to inappropriate content, online bullying, or contact with strangers, which is why the majority have a 13 years plus rating.

As a school, we strongly encourage open conversations with your child about online safety. It's important to remind them to only communicate with trusted friends and family members, and to always come to you if something makes them feel uncomfortable. Setting up privacy settings and regularly checking in on their online activity can also help ensure a safe experience for everyone.
