SCIENTIFIC DISCOVERIES...



Last Friday, the whole school took part in an exciting day of science activities to celebrate Science Day. Each class enjoyed a live, interactive session and participated in a range of hands-on experiments and learning experiences.

Reception Class started the day by exploring the fascinating world of shadows. They had lots of fun creating their very own shadow puppets, learning how shadows are formed, and experimenting with light and dark.

Key Stage 1 students investigated which materials are waterproof after learning about the famous Macintosh coats. They tested different materials using oil, wax, and glue to find out which would be best for keeping dry in the rain. To everyone's surprise, oil turned out to be the winner!

Key Stage 2 explored the concept of friction by designing and building their own marble runs. Their challenge was to create the "slowest" run possible by experimenting with different materials and angles. It was a fun and creative way to see how friction affects movement.

Science Day was a wonderful opportunity for everyone to get hands-on and explore the world of science in a fun and engaging way.

MOBILE PHONES IN SCHOOL

As part of our ongoing commitment to creating a focused and safe learning environment for our entire school community, we would like to kindly remind you of our school's policy regarding mobile phones.

While we encourage pupils to leave their phones at home whenever possible, we want to ensure that both children and staff remain fully engaged in their learning and that the school environment stays secure and supportive. Therefore, we kindly ask that children refrain from using mobile phones anywhere on the school site. This includes the school playground, as well as during drop-off and pick-up times. We have informed the classes that phones should be turned off and put away before they enter the school grounds.

Should any mobile phones be brought to school, they will be securely stored during the day. We would like to reinforce that, ideally, phones should not be brought into school at all. We also encourage parents to monitor their children's use of mobile phones and to ensure they are only using age-appropriate apps.

We sincerely appreciate your support in helping us maintain a respectful and distraction-free environment for all our pupils.
