As our pupils and their families get set for the Easter break, I would like to take this opportunity to share some key highlights of the work Anglian Learning has undertaken during an empowering Spring term.

I begin with a warm welcome to Clare Community Primary School, based in Clare, Suffolk, who joined Anglian Learning alongside Stour Valley Community School on 1st March 2025. One continued focus across our primary schools has been school improvement. At the start of the Spring term, we were pleased to appoint Laura Rawlings, Deputy Director of Primary Education, who has been supporting our ongoing primary school improvement work, driven by a clear focus on progress, attainment, and targeted support.

Working closely with school leaders, we have analysed data forecasts based on progress and attainment over the Autumn term. This has allowed us to reflect on trends, celebrate successes, and identify areas for further development.
