## **Stag Class**

Our learning theme for this half term is...

Why does population change?

Our focus will be on the changing population around the world, looking at how it has changed over time and the reasons behind it. Many of our subjects will be accessed through this theme. Some subjects, such as maths, will continue to be taught separately.

In English, we will be looking at a book called The Arrival by Shaun Tan. The class will be using it as inspiration for their own stories, looking particularly at the use of description.

In Maths, we will be looking at shape for the first two weeks. This will include 2D and 3D shapes as well as accurately measuring and calculating the angles within them. We will then spend a week working on position and direction. This includes mapping points on charts using coordinates and quadrants.

In Geography, we will be studying population change around the world. This will give us an opportunity to look at how it has changed throughout history and inspect the reasons behind this. We will touch on reasons for population growth including resources, healthcare and immigration.

Links to Prior Learning

We will be reviewing our previous scientific knowledge of biology and nature to study classification of plants and animals.

In our Geography lessons we will be calling back on learning from previous history lessons to inform our understanding about why populations around the world have grown.

Our focus in Art will be on drawing and panting. This will largely be left for the week after SATs where we can spend a good deal of time working on different skills within these.

In Science, our focus will be on classification. This follows on well from our previous work on Darwin, to study how animals and plants are classified.

On Thursday afternoons each week Mrs Slingsby will be working with the class teaching RE, PSHE and Music.

**PE will be on Tuesdays and Fridays.** On Tuesdays we will be doing fitness based sessions and on Friday we will be playing tennis. Both sessions will be outside unless the weather prevents this.
