


Transforming lives through inspirational learning'

EARRINGS AND PE - A HEALTH AND SAFETY REMINDER

LET'S KEEP ATTENDANCE ON TRACK!



At The Pines, we know how important it is for every child to be in school, every day. Good attendance helps children feel part of the school community, keeps their learning on track, and supports their well-being.

As school attendance is a legal requirement, we're not able to authorise holidays during term time. While we completely understand the pressures many families are facing with the cost of living, unfortunately, financial reasons are not classed as 'exceptional circumstances' under national guidance—so holidays taken in term time must be recorded as unauthorised. Fines are issued by Suffolk Local Authority and are paid directly to them.

Attendance at our school is regularly reviewed by our Trust, Suffolk Local Authority, and the Department for Education. We are required to follow our attendance policy, which helps us support all children in getting the most from their education.

A couple of friendly reminders:

- If your child is absent and we don't hear from you, the absence will be marked as unauthorised.
- If we suspect that an absence is due to a holiday—even if it hasn't been declared—it will still be recorded as unauthorised.


