NEW ADVENTURES AWAIT: PLAYGROUND REDEVELOPMENT BEGINS!



We are thrilled to share some fantastic news with you. On Friday, 13th June, we received official confirmation that our long-awaited planning permission has been granted! After a detailed and complex process, we can finally move forward with the redevelopment of our school grounds.

To ensure the work is completed efficiently and with minimal disruption to our pupils, some of the minor preparatory work will begin from 7th July. We will take every care to keep any interruptions to the children's playtime as limited as possible.

Our exciting plans include a combination of safe, durable rubber surfacing, astro turf areas, and dedicated planting and wildlife zones to create a vibrant and engaging outdoor space. The children will also benefit from a large sandpit, a digging area, a tunnel, and comfortable seating integrated into the natural mounds around the playground.

In addition, to enhance the biodiversity of our school grounds, our Trust will be installing raised planters, and this autumn we will be planting new trees to increase shade. We will also be sowing meadow grass to encourage wildlife and create a beautiful, natural environment for the children to enjoy.

We can't wait to see the transformation unfold and watch our pioneers enjoy their improved outdoor spaces.

EVERY DAY COUNTS: THE IMPORTANCE OF ATTENDANCE

At The Pines, we know that good attendance is key to helping every child thrive — academically, socially, and emotionally. Being in school every day helps children stay connected with their learning, their friends, and the wider school community.

As attendance is a legal requirement, we are not able to authorise holidays during term time. While we absolutely understand the financial pressures many families are currently facing, the Department for Education states that cost-related reasons do not count as 'exceptional circumstances'.

This means that any term-time holidays must be recorded as unauthorised, and fines will be issued by Suffolk Local Authority — these are processed by and paid directly to them.

It's important to note that:

- If your child is absent and we don't receive a reason, the absence will be marked as unauthorised.
- If we have reason to believe an absence is due to a holiday even if reported as illness — it will still be recorded as unauthorised in line with national guidance.

We are required to follow our attendance policy, which is monitored by our Trust, Suffolk Local Authority, and the Department for Education.

Our shared goal is always to support every child in getting the most from their education.
