Welcome back to our very last half term in Squirrel Class! Your child has now been introduced to their new learning theme; 'Oh, I do like to be beside the seaside!'
Within this theme, the children will be learning map and compass skills to identify where the North and South pole are and knowing the four main points of a compass. We will also touch on the effects of plastic pollution. This builds on previous knowledge as during the Early Years
Foundation Stage your child would have had the opportunity to identify similarities and differences in relation to places.

English

Our Seaside theme will allow us to expose the children to story writing based on The Storm Whale, poetry using Seaside poems, a non fiction unit looking at Seaside life in the past and present day and finally writing postcards and 'a message' in bottle to our new teacher for next year.

<u>Maths:</u>

Our Summer 2 maths topics will include looking at measuring with length, height, volume and mass. Moving onto learning about time and money. We will continue to immerse the children in counting and looking at numbers up to 100. PSHE This term our topic is Relationships. We will talk about our amazing bodies, name the body parts and learn about having healthy relationships.

Music

We will be listening to classical music, leading into the children exploring some improvisations and composing. RE
