SATS RESULTS



We are incredibly proud of our Year 6 children and all they have achieved during their time at The Pines. Whether they started with us in Reception or joined along the way, each one has left their mark and made us proud. Their performance of Robin and the Sherwood Hoodies was a brilliant showcase of talent, teamwork, confidence, and humour - an unforgettable production that had us all laughing in the aisles! Alongside their creative achievements, they demonstrated impressive determination and resilience in their SATs, with results that truly reflect their hard work and positive attitudes. As part of our ecological planting survey conducted this week, we made an exciting discovery - rare Breckland plants are growing right here on our school grounds (Bur Medick Medicago Minima and Smooth Cat's-ear Hypochaeris Glabra)!

This is fantastic news for both our school community and local biodiversity.

Looking ahead to next year, we hope to launch a special conservation project involving our pupils alongside other environmental organisations. The aim will be to enhance and protect these natural Breckland habitats, which are crucial for the survival of several rare insect species.

We're proud to play a vital role in preserving these unique ecosystems, and even more delighted that our pupils will be part of it. Simply by playing in and around these areas, they're already helping with natural seed dispersal!


