Your children have already been introduced to their new learning theme; 'Where did Toys begin?' We have been kindly lent a Toys through time, toybox from Moyse's Hall Museum in Bury St Edmunds which we will be able to explore in our classroom.

English

Our Toys theme will allow us look at narrative texts like Kipper's Toy Box ad The Toy Museum as well as non fiction texts all about Toys in the past and Toys through time. Our English will also be linked to our history topic. The children will be writing simple sentences and using 'and' to extend their ideas.

Maths:

Our Autumn term maths topics will focus our learning on Place Value within 10. Identifying and representing numbers, using language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least Counting to and across 20, forwards and backwards, beginning with zero or 1, or from any given number

RE

In RE we will be looking belonging and why Christians believe that belonging to God and the church family is so important.

Phonics

In Phonics we are consolidating Phase 3 while also learning our Phase 5 sounds.

Music Rhyme in Time

We will be learning to move in time with the beat/pulse, responding to different tempos (speeds).

Science
