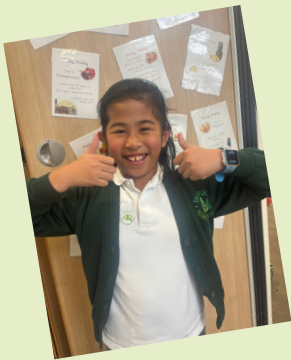




# Our Values

## ENGAGE AND EMPOWER!



On Tuesday each class enjoyed their return to school 'Engage and Empower' day. This gives each class the opportunity to find out what their new theme will be and to spend time reconnecting with their peers and developing their well-being.

Here are some highlights...

### Hedgehog Class - Reception



'I wonder what happens when I fall asleep?'



In Reception we kicked off our new theme by having a PJ day! The children all came to school in their snuggly pyjamas. We collaborated and created our own dreamland and made dream catchers. At the end of the day the parents joined us for hot chocolate and a story. We had such a lovely day!



## Squirrel Class - Year 1

'A classroom journey from Red Lodge to Shanghai'

During our Engage and Empower Day the children were initially 'hooked' into the theme and were shown a variety of different objects based on the theme such as; a post card from Red Lodge and Shanghai, a fan, some noodles and a Chinese dragon. We enjoyed some mindful eating throughout the day and ate some Gyozas paired with some traditional herbal tea.



## Rabbit Class - Year 2

'Flight - let's fly away!'



During our Engage & Empower day the children boarded a flight to Australia! The children listened carefully to the onboard safety announcements before taking off using a flight simulator. We then made model planes and began to learn about the history of flight. We worked as a team to order images of planes from 1490 to the present day.

## Nightingale Class - Year 3

'Walk like an Egyptian!'



In year 3 the children used hieroglyphics to write their names. The children learnt about the process of mummification. Year 3 are now carrying out an experiment and have mummified a tomato! They will leave these for at least 6 weeks to see if it has worked. The children began to learn about the pyramids, how they were created, and why. They then created their own 3D pyramids and hid something secret inside!





## Fox Class - Year 4

'Anglo Saxons - betrayal, battles and bloodshed!'



In year 4, the children learned about creating self-portraits and used mirrors to help them. Some of the class created a picture of how they look now, but some added extra creativity and included some clues about their "inner self", or how they imagined themselves. We also started learning about Anglo-Saxons, beginning with the special alphabet they used, called "runes". Here are the class carving runes into clay, including their initials or names.



## Owl Class - Year 5

'Ancient Greece - It's all Greek to me.'

We introduced our Ancient Greece topic with a History Mystery, where pupils examined images and discussed what the objects were, why they were made, who they were for, and how they were created. Working collaboratively, they then placed Ancient Greece on a timeline alongside other civilisations to develop a sense of chronology. We also had a mindfulness activity where we coloured Greek-inspired vases; this encouraged focus, creativity, and reflection.



## Stag Class - Year 6

'How has the world evolved?'




In Year 6 this half term we are learning about evolution. We spent some time on Tuesday learning about Charles Darwin and his voyage aboard The Beagle. The class worked in teams to figure out what equipment they would need when exploring new lands and even got to inspect some new creatures up close. We thought about how it would feel to discover new species and even created some of our own, thinking about how these animals were suited to their environments.

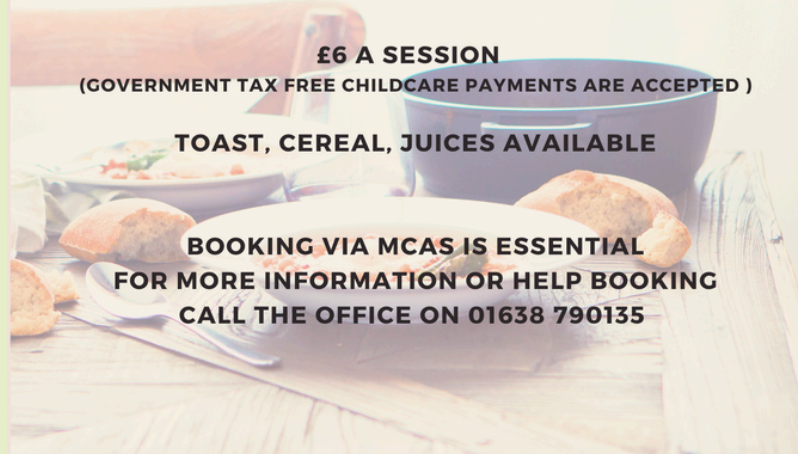

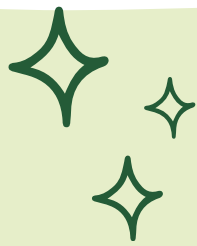
## FREE UNIFORM
